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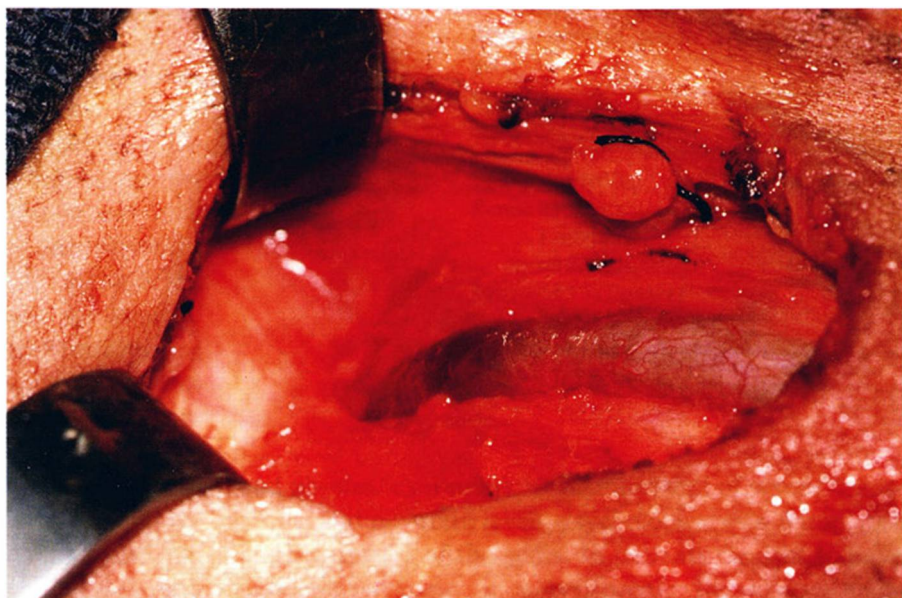
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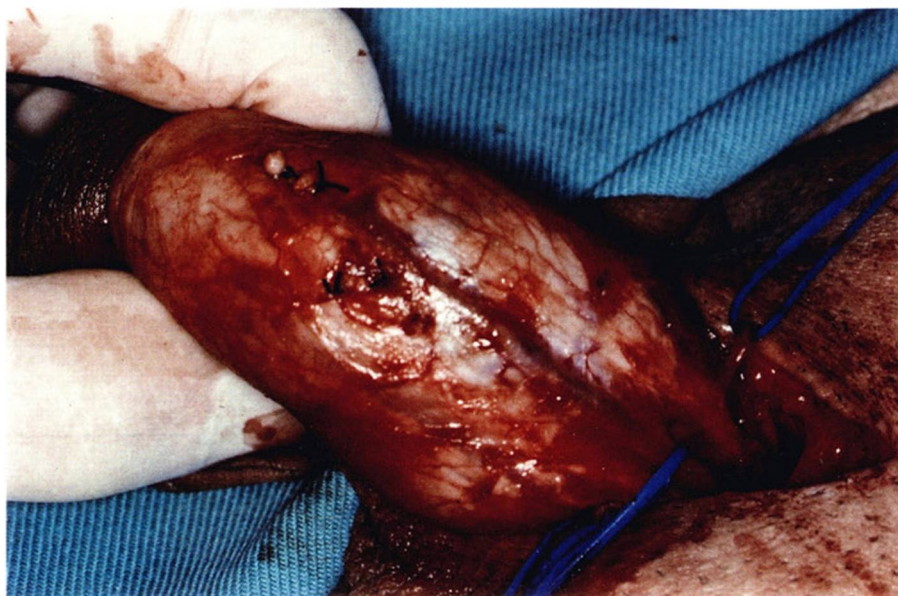
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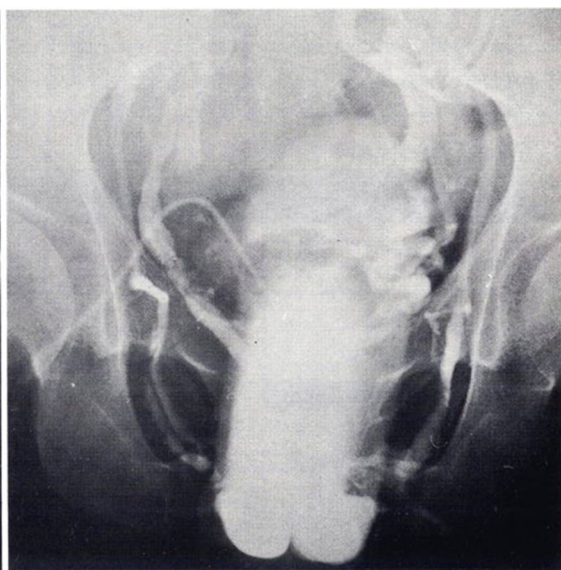
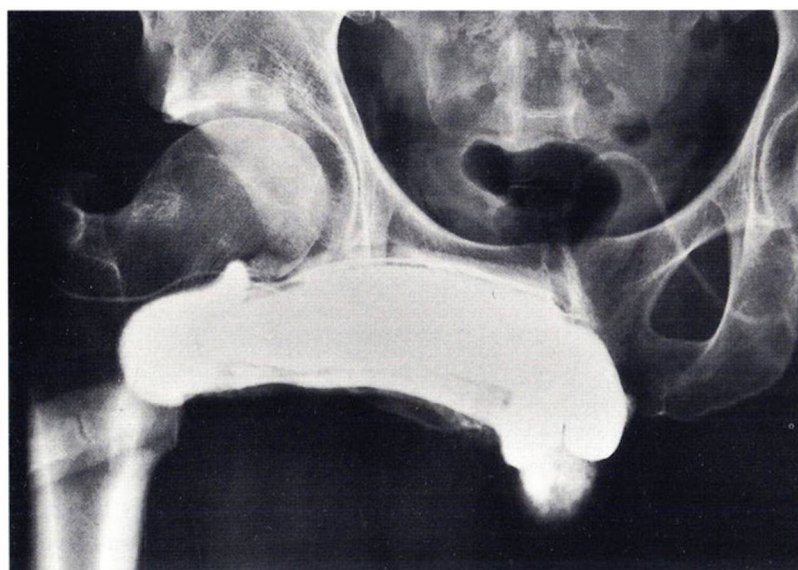
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**Fig. 5.** Suprapubic incision for dorsal isolation of the deep dorsal vein.
