reported metastases at the time of presentation and another 2 cases reported metastatic development 96 and 121 months after diagnosis [2]. All documented metastases were intra-abdominal. Although bony metastases have been reported in ovarian granulosa cell tumour, it has never been reported in testicular granulosa cell tu-

mour [6]. To the authors' knowledge, this is the first case of granulosa cell tumour of the testes metastasising to bone. This highlights the need to maintain a high index of suspicion for extra-abdominal metastases during the long-term follow-up in patients with previous testicular granulosa cell tumour.
